

Proceedings of Feb. Term of County Court

In the matter of Receiving Sealed Proposals for the Superintendency of the Poor Farm, the bid of Alex Slater was accepted, and it was ordered that he be appointed Superintendent for the ensuing year.

The application of Dr C M Ramsdell, to change location of certain county roads, was continued for the term.

The county road petitioned for by D McDonald et al, was continued for the term.

The petition of John Anthony et al, for the opening of a certain county road was granted and the Court ordered the Board of County Road Viewers to meet at commencement of said road, Feb 6, 1906, to view and lay out the same and appraise damages.

In the matter of the selection of county papers for the ensuing year it was ordered by the Court that the Eastern Oregon Observer and the Eastern Oregon Republican be designated as such official papers.

The application of Mike Royce for the return of liquor license fee was continued for the term.

The application of James F Hurley to change boundary lines of road district 35, was granted.

Application for change of boundary of road districts 5, 6, 12, 15 and 18, were also granted.

In the matter of the appointment of a county physician for the ensuing year it was considered and ordered that O E Saunders be appointed.

The application of E J Conrad for a new road district, to be numbered 34, was granted.

The petition of J R Oliver for refund of taxes on double assessment of property owned by Mrs Tertar, but assessed to H H Wilcox, for the year 1905, was granted and it was ordered by the Court that the Clerk draw warrant on the Treasurer in favor of said H H Wilcox in the sum of \$9.09.

The application of Holverson & McFarland for license to sell spirituous and malt liquors in Hillgard precinct, for the period of six months, was granted.

In the matter of refunding the money paid to D Y K Deering, by bidder on 1901 tax sale, it was ordered that the Clerk surrender said money to bidder upon his surrendering certificate of sale in person or upon his written order.
