London, Feb. 22 -- A new mineral valued at \$150 per hundredweight, has been discovered at Ceylon. The fact is recorded in the report on the results you can get more for a dollar just issued, which states that a samof the mineral survey in the island, than a dollar will buy elsewhere ple supposed to be granisite, or pitchblende, proves on complete analysis to be a new mineral which is proposed to dame "thorisnite." Its principal constituent is oxide of thorium, of which 38c per yard it contains 76:22 percent, an amount 30c per yard far higher than that of any mineral known bitherto. Thoris, which is used in the manufacture of incandescent gas mantle, is scorce and is at present chiefly extracted from the monezite sands of Brazil. Thorianite, adds the report, is also radioactive, and a footnote to the report states, on the au thority of Sir William Ramsey, that radium is present in the mineral and that it furnishes considerable quantitics of helium.
