All of the injured are being cared for in the hospitals at Allegheny and Pittsburg.

A NEW FUEL IS DISCOVERED

Business interests of Cincinnati are to have the unique distinction of taking up the development of a scheme that sounds "weird and improbable and yet appears to be a plausible discovery, if the conferences which are being held under the direction of the Cincinnati Industrial Bureau terminate satisfactorily next Friday.

The scheme in a nutshell means the creation of a big stock company for the development of the invention of an Ohio man which will make fuel out of crude oil and water mixed and at a cost of less than half the cost of ordinary coal.

The discovery is along lines brought out in the past by which water is mixed with some inflammable material and is then converted into the two gases which compose it—hydrogen and oxygen—through the combustion of the original oil.

A conference covering several hours was held by directors of the Industrial Bureau yesterday at the Business Men's Club, with E G Holden of Ferobank, who represents the inventor and who is in the city with a view to enlisting the indorsement and financial support of local manufacturers in putting his composition on the market.

Mr Holden has announced that he will in a few days install a boiler in a vacant lot in the city, where tests will be made to demonstrate the value of the discovery and to convince the manufacturers who use steam and large quantities of coal, that the discovery is no myth.

The bureau has agreed to help him to the extent of securing a desirable location to make his demonstrations and with that end in view a meeting of the bureau directors and the other parties directly interested will be held next Friday.
