What Dr. Still Did to Lessen the Pains of Women

Arrests Yet To Follow

(By Scripps News Association)
San Francisco, March 10.—Contrary to the statement made by the police several days ago arrests will be made here if the Honolulu coroners jury finds that Mrs. Jane Stanford was murdered. They state today that no arrests will be made either today or tomorrow, but they admit that they were convinced from the first that Mrs. Stanford was murdered, but say that they had no evidence which would justify them in taking anyone into custody. The authorities intimate that some action will be taken as soon as they receive a report from the detective sent to Honolulu and who arrived there today and was at once placed in possession of all the information in the hands of the island police. Benly, Miss Richardson and several of the present employees at the Stanford mansion are to again be placed in the sweat box with the hope that some additional information may be secured from them.

Rev. Horace M Ramsey

He saw many of the important historic places in England, Germany, Switzerland and Italy, and had charge of St. Paul's Episcopal church at Rome, Italy, in September and October last, during the temporary absence of the Rector. He is now past twenty-four years old and will engage in parochial work.
