**THE GRANDE RONDE RIVER MINES**

There is no question but this year will see greater activity in the mines up Grande Ronde river. It is a fact that few realize how close this city lies to one of the greatest mining belts on the Pacific coast. What is needed to develop this Cripple Creek is the importation of mining men with money. It is true that only a few of the quartz mines have ever been developed but those that have, demonstrate that there are well defined ledges that carry high grade ore and on the dump of several there are many car loads of ore that will pay a profit of the shipping to a smelter. There are a number of mines upon which sufficient development work has already demonstrated the richness of their ores to justify some kind of a reduction works whereby only the concentrates need be shipped out. The following properties are all within a short distance from each other.

**SILVER STAR**  
This mine was located by Mr. Wm. Muir, who sold an interest to Polk May. Over 700 feet of first class tunnel, develops a high grade vein over seven feet wide and on the dump today there are many car loads of rich ore that would pay to ship, but Mr. Muir for several years has had hopes that some mining capitalist would see the opportunity of investment in a reduction works.

**THE LAST CHANCE**  
This mine is owned by S. A. Gardiner, A. T. Hill and Chas. G. Bunt. On this mine is a 100 foot tunnel showing a 3 1/2 foot well defined ledge with the walls in good shape. This mine was located by Henry Bush who has been a well known mining character for 30 years or more.

**PAY BOY**  
This mine with its 800 feet of tunneling has demonstrated its richness by shipping two cars of ore to the Everett smelter that averaged over 152 ounces to the ton at the present silver price means \$92 per ton. This mine and the two named above are within a half mile of each other. This ledge is very rich and was discovered by J. L. Corbett who sold it to Chas. G. Bunt, Joseph Palmer, J. W. Scriber and A. O. Huntington.

**GOOD PROSPECT**  
One half mile above the Pay Boy owned by Book of Baker City and Waldo of Los Angeles. They expect in May to continue their tunnel which is now in 100 feet showing a four foot vein that assays \$42 in gold.
