LET NO GUILTY MAN ESCAPE

Washington, March 11.—By appointment, District Attorney Hensy, Secretary Hitchcock and Attorney General Moody, had a conference with President Roosevelt today in reference to the Oregon land frauds and prosecutions, and later the visitors had luncheon with the President at the White House.

Attorney Hensy detailed to the President what had been done in the various cases, and expressed his confidence in the conviction of Senator Mitchell, not only for violation of the

law prohibiting senators from accepting pay for work in departments, but for accepting pay from Putar and other persons for unlawfully securing action upon land entries pending in the general land office.

Hensy also gave assurance that he had strong cases against Representatives Hermann and Williamson, but that he was not as confident of conviction as in the cases against Mitchell. The President told Hensy to keep up the work and allow no guilty man to escape.—Journal

JURY FINDS CASSIE CHADWICK GUILTY

Cleveland, March 13.—The trial of Mrs. Chadwick for conspiracy to commit an offense against the United States in that she entered into a conspiracy to procure the certification of checks on a national bank at a time when she had no money in the bank, came to an end Saturday evening, when the jury returned a verdict of guilty against the accused woman.

Mrs. Chadwick was found guilty on seven counts which related to the certification of checks with no funds on deposit. On all of these the jury found against her.

According to the law she can be fined on each count not more than \$10,000 nor imprisonment for more than two years on each count.

At first Mrs. Chadwick failed utterly to grasp the meaning of the verdict, but when the import dawned upon her, her limbs seemed to give way beneath her and she sunk feebly into a chair, her head fell forward on her hands and a succession of strangling sobs came from her. She was carried to the office of Marshal Chandler and placed on a sofa. An attack of hysteria followed which lasted fully fifteen minutes, her sobs and cries being distinctly audible in the hall outside. In about half an hour Mrs. Chadwick was restored to comparative composure and she was then taken to jail.

From the time of leaving the marshal's office until the door of the jail closed behind her, she kept up a continuous moaning that was distressing to hear. The court will hear argument on a new trial at a later date.
