Washington, March 15.—After a series of conferences this morning between several prominent Senators and the President, it was decided to let the Santo Domingo treaty go over without a vote until the next session of congress. Owing to the absence of republican members, the treaty would be killed by the Democrats.

Adams Men Fail

Denver, Col March 14.—The attempt of the followers of Governor Adams to procure an adjournment of the legislature sine die, thus leaving Adams in the gubernatorial chair, failed by one vote. This is considered as a victory for Peabody.

[Later] It is rumored this afternoon that two of the supporters of Governor Adams in the legislature have been kidnapped, but the report is not verified. The final vote to determine whether Adams will retain the executive chair will be close. Lieutenant Governor McDonald claims a right to vote in case of a tie in the joint assembly, which will meet at two thirty this afternoon.
