Health Is A Question . of Mechanics

Under cetain conditions the human body is subject to disease. Disease in the main is a penalty imposed upon us by Nature for some criminal assault upon our bodies, or possibly mere neglect of its wants, or it may be the direct result of some accidental injury. Consider the origin of the word. The prefix dis has a regative meaning. We all know what ease signifies. We like case. We court it. It is good for one. Dis-ease, then, means no-ease or not-easy, in ether words unessiness, the extreme degree of which readily becomes pain or eickness.

ducting enery process of the body In connection with the brain trere is a great cable carrying many bunles of these 'live' wires, or nerves . This cable is the spinal cord. It is encased in a canal of twenty-four bones connected together by the muscles From between these bones or vetebrae pass thirty one pairs of spinal inerves.

Some of these nerves go to the muscles and some by the way of the Sympathe tic Nervous System to the different organs of the body. If a vertebra should be slipped somewhat-even slightly-from its position so as to pinch on one of these nerves, perhaps irritating, possibly paralysing it, the organ it supplies would then become either irritated or torpid, A disturbed rib or any other misfit at a joint-no matter how slight its degree-is thus to press on an important nerve or vessel and interfere with its action

Then, now necessary it is to have this frame work of such a delicate machine in perfect adjustment?
