Historic Relics

Paris, March 21.—Excavations in the Place de la Bastille for the extension of the Metropolitan and subway have led to the discovery of the main postern of the drawbridge of the historic prison fortress. Hewn stone and rusted iron cannon balls were also unearthed and taken to the Musee Carnavalet. The gate itself will be carefully excavated. All the stone will be numbered and the postern reconstructed on the avenue Henri IV, where part of one of the towers of the Bastille is already set up.

New Regulations

As a result of investigations of the Slocum disaster, the department of commerce and labor at Washington has made important changes in the rules as to safety requirements for steam vessels carrying passengers. Some of the most important changes are as follows:

"Metal air tanks are required in life boats; kapok life preservers and loose granulated cork are prohibited in life-boats and life rafts; all passenger steamers must be provided with fire buckets, barrels and axes; lamp lockers and oilrooms must be provided with steam fire branches and be mental lined; all hose connections after March 1 must be U.S. standard pipe thread; portable fire extinguishers according to tonnage of vessel, must be provided; fire hose must be tested up to 100 pounds pressure to the square inch, and fire mains must be on all decks; ferryboats must be equipped with life preservers proportionate to the number of square feet of passenger deck surface; the flashing of search lights in a pilot house of passing vessels is prohibited.

IOWA TRAIN WRECK

(By Scripps News Association) Des Moines, Iowa, March 21.—The Rocky Mountain Limited on the Rock Island railroad was wrecked near Homestead, Iowa, at twelve fifteen this morning. The railroad officials assert that the wreck was the work of robbers. Part of the train was derailed and thrown down a fifteen foot embankment. Two of the train men, and a mail clerk, were probably fatally injured. Three hundred feet of the track was torn up, and the engine, mail car, composite car, and the Denver and Colorado sleepers left the track.

Largest Blast Furnace

Annooda, Mont March 21.—The largest blast furnace in the world was put into successful operation here Sunday at the Washoe smelter. The big furnace is as large as three of the ordinary size, having an inside measurement of 51 feet by 55 inches. The blast is fed by 88 tuyers and in 24 hours charges of ore aggregating 2000 tons are turned into copper matte.

FALL FROM BALLOON

(Special Dispatch) Wallace, March 21.—In a double balloon ascension, yesterday, the lower part of the balloon tore away when the two aeronauts, Prof. O'Dell and Dell Dare, were between 150 and 200 feet in the air, and both were dashed to the ground. Nearly every bone in O'Dell's body was broken. He is still alive but is expected to die at any moment. Dare did not sustain a broken bone but was internally injured and died at 6 o'clock tonight.

BOY SERIOUSLY HURLED

A young boy named Gibson was caught by the falling balloon and completely covered. The hot air burned him about the face and body before he could be dragged from underneath. As soon as the balloon left the ground the lower part of the bag could be seen ripping away. Warnings were shouted to the two men, but they could not hear the alarm. When between 150 and 200 feet high the two men seated in separate parachutes swung together with a crash that could be heard for a long distance and at the same time the lower portion tore away and the men fell.
