IS THERE A TEMPTER?

Is there a tempter standing close to the ear of President Castro and urging him to disaster? Not content with the outrage perpetrated on American interests in his seizure of the asphalt lakes, President Castro followed with a notice to the French cable company of his intention to cancel the concession and seize on the cable. To that he has added the actual seizure of the coal mines of Guanto Naricul which for thirty-three years have been leased to and operated by an Italian company. If he is merely desirous of a storm he is in line to have his wishes gratified, but it is difficult to imagine any man in possessian of his sober senses acting as Castro is acting, without some one or some power at his side tempting him and and influencing bits with promises of support. Either that, or President Castro needs examination by an alienist.

The Crop Reporter for March 1905, a monthly published by authority of the Secretary of Agriculture, resched the Observer on Wednesday merning. It gives the total of the wheat crop of 1904 in the United States at 552,390,517 bushels and the amount remaining in farmers hands on March 1 was 111,000,000 bushels or 20.1 per cent of the crop grown.

Oregon grew 14,050,193 hu. of wheat in 1904 of which 64 per cent or 8,992,123 bushels were shipped out of the county in which grown.

Fourteen per cent of the Oregon wheat crop of 1904 was reported on hand on March 1.
