AFTER PEACE WHAT?

A great war is about to close. It has attracted the attention of the human race more universally than any conflict in modern times, because there is hardly a nation in the civilized world, Christian, Mohammed or heathen but intuitively felt when the war began that the present equilibrium of the world was being jared by the clash of tremendous armed forces; energized by the ambition of each of the parties to the strife to materially change the existing relations, politically and commercially among the people of earth.

The accomplishment of Russia's ambition would place that empire in control of Asia with its half billion of people which added to its present population would make the Czar supreme ruler of about three-fourths of the human race.

The thwarting of Russia's plans, by the success of the Mikado, will make that astute ruler the virtual director in all things Oriental and dissolve the dream of the western world, it has indulged in for centuries, of growing fabulously rich and immeasurably strong by securing control of the Oriental trade and dominion over the populous and wealthy, but effete people of Asia. The time may come when Americans will cease to wrap the mantle of self conceit about them, pat their pride swollen breasts and proclaim "We are of a superior race, power and dominion belongs to us."
