



### BOMB MAKER IS CONVICTED

New York, March 27—Gosner Russell, also known as Gessler Rousseau, was convicted today before Recorder Goff of having sent with malicious intent an infernal machine to the Cuban steamer Umbria in this city on May 5, 1903. The prisoner received the verdict calmly and without comment and was remanded to the Tombs on Friday. The maximum penalty for the offense is five years imprisonment. In his testimony Rousseau said: "I have made many infernal machines during my life, and during the Cuban rebellion I sold a number of them to agents for Cuba in this country. They were for blowing up Spanish ships and I gave full instructions as to their use." He said he always made enough money to go on with his work, and that during the Boer war he offered infernal machines to the Boer agents in this country but that his offer had been refused, the Boers saying they did not care to fight that way.

### MRS. CHADWICK HAS AN EQUAL

Philadelphia, March 28.—Nearly \$1,000,000 in hard cash and negotiable bonds, mostly the proceeds of the business conducted by the Storey Cotton company, slipped from under the noses of the authorities into the possession of Sophia E. Beck, and out of the country with her, over a week ago. Sophia Beck was the stenographer of the Storey Cotton company. She is said to have been the personal representative of Frank Marrin, the backer of the concern, and to have been one of the principals in all deals swung by that concern.

The money was obtained by shrewd transfers of property in the name of Frank Marrin and Ewart Storey. The Beck woman, who is regarded by the secret service agents as the equal of Jesse L. Chadwick, if not her peer, slipped aboard an ocean liner with it and was upon the high seas before any one realized what had happened.

Postal Inspector Meyer of Chicago, the man who worked up the postal scandal at Washington, is now close upon the trail of Marrin, alias Judge Franklin Stone Meyer has positive information that Marrin is going to attempt to leave the country within the next few days. It is believed he expects to meet the Beck woman at some rendezvous in England, where they will also find Storey.

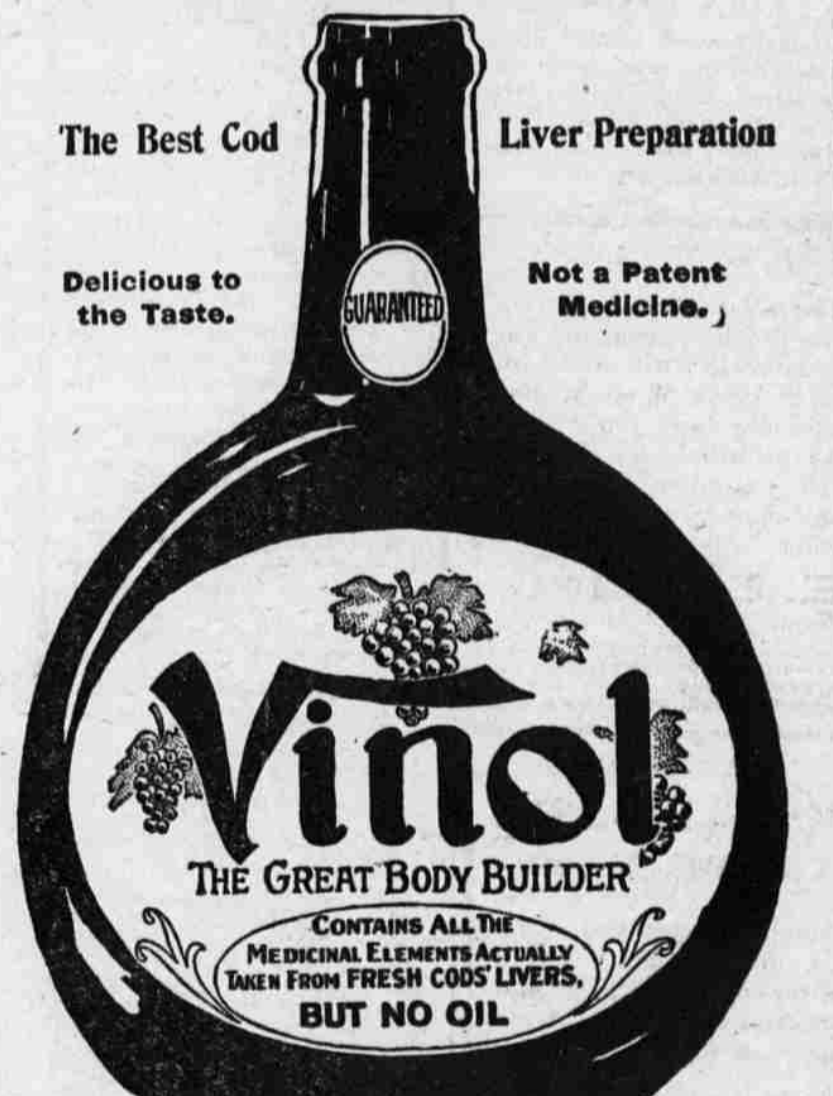
