MORTON MAKES SHORT VISIT

Washington March 28—Secretary of the Navy, Morton, who recently left on the Dolphin for Porto Rican and Cuban ports, has found it necessary to curtail his visits at the different places where stops are scheduled to be made in order that he might return to Washington in time to join the Presidential party, which will leave here April 3 for Texas and Colorado.

A hurried call was made at San Juan, and even with brief stops at Guantanamo and Havana, it is calculated that the Dolphin barely will land the Secretary in the United States in time to start with the President on his journey.

Noted Pallbearers

Washington March 28—The honorary pall bearers at the funeral today of the late Senor don Manuel de Aspiroz, Mexican Ambassador, were announced today as follows:

Secretary of the Treasury Shaw, Acting Secretary of the State Adee, Count Cassini, Russian Ambassador, Baron Edmondo Mayor des Planches, Italian Ambassador, A. Grip, Minister from Sweden and Norway, Senor Calvo, Minister from Costa Rica, Chief Justice Fuller of the United States Supreme Court, Senator Selby M. Culom, Representative R. R. Hitt and John W. Foster.

Senor Gamsos, the Charge d'Affaires today called on Acting Secretary of State Adee and expressed the appreciation of the Mexican government for the regrets of this Government. President Diaz also personally replied to President Roosevelt's message of sympathy.

Recorder's Office

County recorder D. H. Proctor, when asked yesterday relative to the receipts of his office, drew forth a slip of paper with the following figures taken from his books which makes a very creditable showing for his office. During the year 1904 his receipts were \$3275 70, making an average for the twelve months of \$273. The expenses, salaries and other expenses were \$2500, leaving a net profit of \$775.

Unconstitutional

Lewiston March 28—The Supreme Court, in a divided opinion, annulled the act creating Lewis and Clark counties out of Kootenai. The opinion was by Justice Ailshie, Justice Sullivan concurring. Chief Justice Stockslager dissented.

FAMOUS ACTRESS CONTESTS WILL

San Francisco March 27—The Superior Court today handed down a decision in which it is held that the probating of the will of Alex Dunsmuir in British Columbia is illegal, on the ground that Alex Dunsmuir was a resident of California. The proceedings in British Columbia were declared void and the will must be administered in California. Under the will, James Dunsmuir was executor and sole legatee, depriving Mrs. Alex Dunsmuir, now dead, and her daughter Edna Wallace Hopper, the actress, of any share in the eight million dollar estate which he left. Mrs. Hopper instituted the proceedings in which the opinion was rendered today, and is therefore given the opportunity to contest the will in this state.
