London March 29- It transpires that the Culliman diamond, the 3,032karat gem found in the Premier mine at Johannesburg, January 27, made the journey from Cape Town to Ecgland by ordinary registered poet at a coss of 75 cents. The postal authorities were ignorant of the fact that they had been intrusted with such a valuable consignment. The gem is estimated to be worth between \$4,000, 000 and \$5,000,000. To send a package of that value by express would cost a large sum.
