## FIVE HUNDRED PEOPLE WRECKED

Winnipeg, Manitoba, March 30—The third section of the home-seekers' excursion train, which left Toronto last Tuesday, filled with settlers for the northwest, went into a ditch at Dryden, eighty-five miles east of Ratportage. The accident is said to be the worst in the history of the Canadian Pacific Railroad. All the doctors at Ratportage have left that city for the scene. The railroad officials refuse to make any statement in regard to the catastrophe. There were five hundred passengers on the train.

Later—Eight coaches were derailed and several of the passengers were injured, but none were killed.

## Subway Caved

New York March 30—Fireman Samuel Lillie was instantly killed today and several firemen were injured by a cave in the subway, at 168th station which burned yesterday. The fireman were carrying hose through the dark tunnel extinguishing the burning timbers when the accident occurred.

## Engineer Killed

Butte, Mont. March 30—The Great Northern Overland, west-bound, was derailed at noon today near Basin Montana. The engineer John Weber was scalded and crushed to death and the fireman Tom Davis was seriously hurt. The engine jumped the track while running at the rate of thirty miles per hour.

She left a candle burning in her room after turning on the gas, and, when the deadly carbon monoxide had accumulated to a sufficient density it exploded with terrific force setting fire to the room and frightfully burning the corpse.
