OUR EXPORTS AND IMPORTS

The people of the United States exported to foreign countries for the seven months ending with January 1905, stuffs valued at \$887,107.899, of this \$704,414,783 worth was carried in steam ships owned by foreigners and \$24,781,810 worth was carried in foreign sailing vessels, making a total of our domestic exports carried in foreign ships of \$728,596,843.

For the same time there were carried in American steamships \$87,234,451 worth of our domestic merchandise and \$6,077,960 in American owned sailing vessels, the balance was carried by railroad cars and other land vehicles to Canada and Mexico.

For the seven months ending with January 1905, the United States imported from foreign countries merchandise valued at \$625,933,101, of this \$479,588,380 worth was carried to us in steamships owned by foreigners and \$1,025,978 in foreign owned sailing vessels, making a total of our imports of \$490,614,358 worth of foreign merchandise brought to us in the seven months in foreign owned ships.

During the same seven months steamships belonging to U.S. citizens brought to us \$83,981,984 worth of foreign goods, and American owned sailing vessels carried to us from foreign lands \$5,072,787 worth of foreign merchandise.

In 1860 the total United States imports and exports by sea were valued at \$762,288,550 of which 66.9 per cent was carried in ships owned by citizens of the United States. In 1903 our imports and exports amounted to \$2,445,860,916 of which American owned ships brought us but 9.1 per cent.

These dry statistics become items of live interest in discussing plans for reviving our merchant marine so that the richest nation of the age will not be dependent on the ship owners of other countries to enable it to carry to market our enormous crops and other products and save to our people the annual freight bills of over \$200,000,000 which we have been paying to foreign ship owners for years.

If a hosiery factory is as profitable as the San Francisco trade journal, which we publish elsewhere states and the conditions are as favorable as represented, why not have one in La Grande? A pay roll that furnishes labor for thirty employees that only costs \$10,000 and pays handsome dividends on that amount, should not be overlooked by as live a community as this.
