THE PRESIDENT **STARTS WEST**

 Washington, April 3—The President is now on his great western tour. He left this morning at 9:05 on a special train composed of three cars. His first stop will be at Louisville tomorrow morning. A number of department officials including Secretaries Cortell-y and Meloy were at the station to bid the President goodbye.

His departure was slightly delayed by a slight accident. While on the way to the depot one of the horses attached to his carriage slipped and fell when in front of the treasurer building. Both horses were soon in an extricable tangle. Secretary Leab and Dr. Lambert disentangled the struggling horses and as neither of the horses were seriously injured the carriage proceeded to the depot.

New Organ Found

Chicago April 3—A wonderful discovery has been made by Prof. J. T. Wilson of the University of Chicago. It is the new organ of taste, and the noted pedagogue calls it the "taste bud." It is found in the larynx, and all through the neck.

Experiments proved that it is just below the surface of the lining. Just what the individual function of the new organ is, Wilson does not know. He declares that it repels drinks and foods having a sour taste, and welcomes those having a sweet taste.

Anything sour or ill tasting that goes down the throat makes the "taste bud" contract. Strong drink and strong food is not welcomed by the "taste bud."

Result of Hazing

Grand Rapids Mich April 3—Herbert Lake, aged 16, is near death as the result of hazing by members of a high school Greek letter fraternity. One of the features of the initiation consisted of a slide down a steep hill locked in a coffin.

Lake was also forced to swim a snow-filled gutter and underwent other nerve racking tortures in the fraternity room. He was lowered in a coffin attached to ropes from the roof of the five-story Auditorium building.

Lake, who is the son of a widow, refuses to give information that will lead to the identification of his tormentors.

Funeral Services

Oregon City Ore April 2—The Odd Fellows and the Rebecca Lodge met at noon today in Odd Fellow's Hall and there made preparations for attending the funeral of late County Clerk, F. A. Slight, which took place at 1 p m. The funeral services were held at the family residence and the body was interred at Mountain View cemetery. This funeral was one of the largest ever held in the county.

Hatchery Output

The output of young fish at the Ontario salmon hatchery this season will be 4,500,000. Superintendent Brown has already turned 200,000 young fish into the river.

The other fish will be turned out at intervals until about the first of May when the youngest ones will be turned loose. When the young fish are hatched out they are fed and cared for at the hatchery about six weeks when they are turned loose to make their own living.

On account of his experience and knowledge of the fish industry Superintendent Brown of the Ontario fish hatchery has been selected by State Fish and Game Warden Van Dusen to have charge of the Oregon fish exhibits at the Lewis and Clark fair.—E. O.
