THE REFERENDUM MOVEMENT

The referendum movement is growing. The Montana legislature has decided to submit to the people of that state a constitutional amendment providing for the initiative and referendum. This has been the result of a contest which began with the people and has finally resulted in the capture of the legislature. Montana will be the fifth state to vote on this subject.

The other states are South Dakota, Utah, Oregon and Illinois. The last Nevada legislature voted to submit a constitutional amendment providing for a direct initiative, but as it requires two legislatures to act favorably on such an amendment it goes over to the next legislature.

In Utah two republican legislatures have refused to put a constitutional amendment into operation. In South Dakota the republican legislature has shown a disposition to ignore the provisions of the referendum amendment, but the cause of direct legislation is growing. Those who believe in bringing the government nearer to the people will support it when they understand it.—Commoner.

LOOSING

POPULATION

Those community enthusiasts who have been talking revelations of civic greatness as revealed through the assessor's official state census, will receive a short-arm jolt in the solar plexus when they have pored over the tabulations now being made.

The enumerators have completed their tasks, the last one getting in his sheets this morning. With the best that the enumerators promise in prospective occupancy or vacant residents by new people, the total according to one of the regular deputies will be about 5,980 as against 6,663 for the federal census of five years ago.

The enumerators are very positive that they have covered the field fully and completely. Their work is now on file and as soon as it has been gone over for, the final tabulations may be inspected by all who have an interest in the matter.

A tabulation will be printed when the work is completed.—Baker City Herald.
