### Mormon Conference

Salt Lake April 7-The seventy fifth annual conference of the Mormon church convened today in the sabernacle and will continue until Sunday. The city is filled with conference visitors from all parts of this and adjoining states and many representatives from Canada, Mexico and other distant countries. A postle Reed Smoot is not in attendance, as he left yesterday for Ban Francisco. The opening session of the conference was addressed by President Joseph P Smith,

President Smith in his address referred to some recent criticisms of the policy of the church under his leadership. Speaking of his critics, who are or have been within the church the president said they were "the boile carbuncies and othes excressences on the body of the organization." In such instances, he said, there was "but one thing to do, what the surgeon does when the patient is thus afflicted, cut them cut and off."

If any members of the church were dissatisfied with the manner in which the tithings had been handled, les them complain, he said, and he would 3 p m gladly meet them. If the church 6:30p m desired to call him to account it could Prayer Meeting Thursday 7:30 p m be done without causing noise or dis-

Speaking generally of the expenditures, he said the people of the church in the southwest had suffered heavily from floods and the church had helped them. The church had purchased a piece of land in Jackson county, Missouri, for the erection of a temple as foretold by the prophet, Joseph Smith. Large sums bad been expended in foreign lands including Great Britain Norway, Pweden and the islands of the south seas, where land has been bought and churches established. More than half of the bonded indebtedness of the church had been paid off, President Smith said, and the church rould soon be free from debt

Hugh J Cannon, just returned from a three years' mission in Germany, told of the activeness of the Mormon missionaries in Germany, Switzerland. Austria, Hungary, Roumania and Servia. He said missionsries soon would be sent over the Alps into Italy. He spoke of the opposition to the Mornone in Germany and said :100 missionaries had been banished from Prussia in one year.
