CEMENT WALKS ON BUSINESS STREETS

The city council held another meeting last night to complete the work carried over from Wednesday night.

An ordinance was passed granting the La Grande Light and Power Co., a franchise for thirty years. This is simply a continuation of their present franchise.

An ordinance establishing the grades after considerable examination, was read the third time and passed.

An ordinance providing for the construction of wood and cement sidewalks was passed. This ordinance provides for cement walks to be constructed on Depot st from Washington Avenue, to Jefferson st, or from the Commercial Club to the Mint saloon and on Adams Avenue from the Foley House to Henry & Carr's. After the passage of this ordinance a resolution was passed providing that the cement walks shall be constructed within the above districts by August 1.

An ordinance was passed granting the La Grande Light and Power Co., a franchise for thirty years. This is simply a continuation of their present franchise.

A resolution was passed granting the district meeting of the Knights of Pythias which will honor La Grande with their presence on May 6th, the use of the courthouse for their competitive drill.

The Ways and Means committee was instructed to advertise for bids for the removal of the temporary building which provided quarters for the county officers during the construction of the city hall.

Blown To Pieces

A U Lamb, of Tucson Ariz superintendent of the Tres Amigos mine has been blown to pieces by an infernal machine while asleep in his home at the edge of town. Several sticks of dynamite were placed under a corner of the house and a five foot fuse attached. When it was exploded the house and contents were scattered all over the hillside. Fragments of Lamb's body were found at places a half mile apart. Lamb's wife and family were in the east on a visit.

At the coroner's inquest a verdict of murder by persons unknown was returned but arrests are expected to follow. Lamb has been involved in several bitter disputes about mining property and it is presumed one of his enemies made in these quarrels committed the deed. A strict investigation is being made.

Will Wed Jewess

J Phelps Stokes, of New York millionaire son of Anson Phelps Stokes has announced his engagement to Rose Harriet Pastor, a young Jewess who has been recently employed as a writer for a Jewish newspaper. She formerly worked in a Cleveland cigar factory. The wedding will take place in the latter part of July.

This is a romance of the east side settlement work in which Stokes has been engaged for some time. He has lived at the university settlement house in Eldridge street and has taken a leading part in the charitable and educational movements emanating from that center. It was there that he met Miss Pastor. She will be 26 years old in July, and was born in Angstrom, Suwalk, Russia.

Fight For Fuel

Vienna April 7—A dispatch from Vilna states that all of the able bodied men in the district have been sent to war by the czar. The women and children invaded the imperial forest and began to cut the dead timber, arguing as their protectors were away in the service of the emperor there could be no harm in securing fuel to warm themselves from the dead falls in the woods. The foresters drove them away and beat a number of them cruelly. The next day the women armed with clubs and axes, returned and attacked the foresters. They burned the house of the chief forester and so badly injured him and three of his assistants that all are expected to die.

Refuse to Pay Rent

Borisoff Russia, April 7—At many places in the Minsk government the peasants are refusing to pay rent for their lands, declaring it belongs to them. The landowners are powerless as the peasants threaten to destroy everything it troops are summoned.
