DROWNED IN A SPRING

George Gettle, an aged German, yesterday fell into a spring and was drowned before assistance reached him. The facts in the case, as they were detailed to Coroner Henry, are as follows: The Gettles own a place on Rock Creek, and also one in Fruitdale; yesterday Mr. Gettle and his son were at the mountain ranch, and the mother was at Hilgard. The old gentleman was at the house and the son was working about the place. The old gentleman needed some water and taking a bucket went to the spring and in some manner fell in. About three o'clock the son came to the spring for a drink and was horrified to find his father in the water. He drew the body out, and at once notified the neighbors, and the mother. The remains were brought to town yesterday evening and placed in charge of Coroner Henry. After listening to the facts, the Coroner decided that it would be unnecessary to hold an inquest, and the funeral will take place tomorrow at ten o'clock from the Catholic church, Rev. Father Whyte officiating. The deceased was seventy two years of age and leaves a wife and six children.

Indian Decision

Washington, April 11.—The supreme court today rendered an opinion that when the United States allots land to an Indian and grants him political citizenship, giving him the benefit of and requiring him to be subject to the laws of the state, both civil and criminal, that act places him outside of the reach of the police regulations on the part of congress. The decision was rendered in the case of a Kananan who was convicted of selling liquor to a Kickapoo Indian. He appealed to the supreme court for a writ of habeas corpus on the ground that in becoming an allottee the Indian became a citizen of the United States. This view is sustained by the supreme court, which ordered the discharge of the petitioner.

Accomplices of Tracy

Salem Ore April 10—Harry Wright, alias H. U. Mutchart, and Charles Monte, alias W. Bennett, were yesterday indicted by the state grand jury upon a charge of murder in the first degree for the killing of Frank Farrell one of the three prison guards killed by Convicts Tracy and Merrill during the outbreak of June 9 1908. Wright and Monte are implicated as accessories before the fact in smuggling the goods and ammunition into the penitentiary with which Tracy and Merrill effected their escape. Wright is serving a three-year sentence at the Walla Walla prison for grand larceny and Monte is serving six years in the Oregon state prison for burglary.

Governor Chamberlain will issue a requisition for the extradition of Wright, whose term of sentence expires April 17.

Bright Outlook

Karl Stackland of the Cove is in the city today, and it certainly is an inspiration to talk to him. He lives in the hope that this is going to be the banner year for Grande Ronde valley and his reasons substantiate his claims. Being a large fruit grower, he is naturally a close observer, and he states that this year's apple tree planting, which he estimates at 40,000 trees will bring Union County to the front and give us the reputation of being famous as the apple producing country in the United States. Why? because we are planting those varieties that grow to perfection and always bring the best prices.

In early fruits Mr Stackland expects the best prices that have been enjoyed for many years, because all of the early fruits of the central west and as far east as Ohio have been greatly damaged and we will be called upon to fill the demand.

He is also enthusiastic over our coming apple crop and predicts that we will have at least 100 car loads more to export than we did last season from the fact that many new orchards will greatly add to the volume of the product and that the trees are all full.

Get In Line

Now that cement walk work is started properly in this city it is to be hoped that property owners will have the work pushed, and get the walks and gutters on Adams Ave and Depot street in, before the rush of Eastern investors strike this section. Nothing adds more to the looks of a city than good walks and streets, or attracts people quicker. An Observer man was talking with Mr Scott, of Scott & Kuhn, today, and the firm is now offering to put in the walk, curb and gutter for a 30 foot lot, for \$108 where the fill does not amount to much. This is certainly a reasonable price, in view of the stringent specifications of the ordinance, which city surveyor Seitzer says must be lived up to in every respect, or the walk will be condemned. The specifications here are said to be the strongest in the country and if lived up to absolutely, will give us walks that will be perfect. But the people should hurry the good work along.
