About three o'clock the son came to the spring for a drink and was borrifled to find his father in the water. He drew the body out, and at once notified the neighbors, and the mother. The remains were brought to town yesterday evening and placed in charge of Coroner Henry. After listening to the facts, the Coroner decid-ed that it would be unnecessary to bold an inquest, and the funeral will take place tomorrow at ten o'clock from the Catholic church, Rev. Father Whyte officiating. The deceased was seventy two years of age and leaves a wife and six children

Indian Decision

Washington, April 11. - The supren court today rendered an opinion that when the United States allots land to an Indian and grants him privileg of citizenship, giving him the benefit of and requiring him to be subject to the laws of the state, both civil anp criminal, that act places him outside of the reach of the police regulations on the part of congress The decision was rendered in the case of a Kansan who was convicted of selling liquor to a Kickapoo Indian. He appealed to the supreme court for a writ of babeas cor pus on the ground that in becoming an allottee the Indian became a citizen of the United States. This view is sustained by the supreme court, which ordered the discharge of the petitioner.
