Chicago April 12—A hundred extra policemen were detailed this morning to guard the wagons of The Montgomery Ward Co. This is the answer of Mayor Dunne to the appeal of the strike leaders in which they complained of the officiousness of the police in protecting the non-union drivers.

The coal team owners today delivered fuel to Montgomery Ward Co despite the warning that the union would order a strike against them. Detectives have been employed to watch the express wagon drivers and get evidence upon which to base a petition in the Federal Court to enjoin interference with interstate commerce.

Tries To Burn Jail

Weiser, April 12—J. W. Lawrence, the man who is in jail charged with attempting to break open the safe in Felthouse Bros. grocery store, made an attempt to burn the county jail yesterday afternoon and almost succeeded in cremating himself. He set fire to the bed which was entirely destroyed. When the fire was discovered Lawrence was almost suffocated. The fire was extinguished and Lawrence resuscitated.

Charged With Theft

Seattle, April 12—Mrs. L. A. Freestone, wife of the chief amalgamator of the big Treadwell gold mines at Juneeau, was arrested here this afternoon on the charge of stealing \$600 in gold dust from the company's mills. The dust was located at the local United States assay office. Mrs. Freestone had just deposited it. The prisoner admits that she secured the gold dust unlawfully, but she has refused to give details of how she came in possession of it.
