\$50,000 Farm

David Eccles, president of the sugar factory, closed the sale for 900 acres of land from Hall Bros., near Union, yesterday, paying \$50,000 spot cash. This gives the company 2490 acres in one body of fine sugar beet land all of which can be irrigated from Catherine creek, and in fact this gives them the control of Catherine creek for quite a distance.

The sugar beet culture has passed through the experimental stage and each year the acreage will become larger and larger. The Cove country offers another great beet acreage just as soon as they are connected with an electric road which at this time seems to be assured this year.

With Russian Army

Leavenworth April 8.—Orders were received at Fort Leavenworth yesterday directing Colonel John R. Van Hoff, medical corps, stationed here but at present in New York City, to proceed to join the Russian army in Manchuria as a representative of the United States government. Recently Colonel Valery Hayward, representing the medical corps, was captured near Mukden and is unable to join the Russians again. Colonel Hoff was with the China relief expedition as chief surgeon, and as chief surgeon in Porto Rico in 1898 1900.
