Fred Jacobs received a car load of furniture this morning and now has a force of men unloading it.

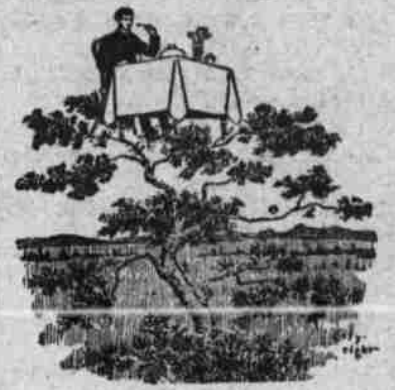
W T Cross left this morning for Nebraska after another train load of bogs for the Union Meat Company of Portland.
