Workmen yesterday put the finishing touches to the Gillin & Hogan undertaking parlors, and it is safe to say that their rooms now present as neat and artistic appearance as any in the state. They have five large rooms which afford them a floor space of four thousand square feet, with a frontage on Depot street of thirty feet. The reception room is neatly furnished and care has been taken to allow no suggestion of the morgue, or death house to prevail in this room. Opening off this room are two handsome appointed private offices, where those who have business to transact may do so with freedom and seclusion. A prominent feature of this establishment is the large and handsome chapel where funeral services may be held. The chapel has a seating capacity of nearly two hundred, and is equipped with an organ and ample chairs. In the centre is a large incandescence arc light which can be turned on either day or night. Back of the chapel is the stock room and then the morgue. A complete line of up to date funeral accessories is kept constantly on hand. The embalming and funeral direction is under the management of Mr. M. D. Gillin who has had years of experience and has a license to practice in Oregon and Montana. The public is invited to call and see the handsome line of caskets and view the parlors and chapel. Big Concerns At War

Chicago April 15—The Chicago electrical concerns are advised of a trade war between the two giant electrical manufacturing concerns of the country the General Electric and the Westinghouse Electrical companies. In view of the fact that the combined sales of the two companies last year aggregated more than \$75,000,000 the present trade war is likely to prove interesting to the electrical world. It is reported on authority that the agreement which existed between the two companies has been dissolved and all working agreements excepting that in relation to patents have been cancelled.

Large Lawyers Fee

Lafayette Ind April 15—Judge De Hart in the Circuit Court today, approved allowances aggregating \$118,000 in fees to attorneys who represented Moses Fowler Chase in the famous litigation to establish the guardianship of young Chase and the trusteeship for the million dollar estate of the boy heir, who is confined in a sanitarium at Indianapolis.

According to the petition of Frederick Chase guardian the fees were payable for services in discovering young Chase in an asylum in Paris and the resultant litigation between Charles S. Dubme, on one side, and Frederick S. Chase, on the other, which resulted in the latter being appointed guardian and trustee.

MRS. CHADWICK MAY GIVE BAIL

 Cincinnati, O., April 15—The United States Court of Appeals decided this morning that Mrs. Cassie Chadwick can be released from jail on five thousand dollars bail, pending the hearing of the argument for a new trial. This decision refers only to the case on which she was convicted. There is nothing to do pending the hearing.

Doing More Work

The O R & N railway company will, in a few days, begin work on changing the channel of Burnt river, about five miles below Durkee. This will be done in order to secure a safer road bed and to prevent the washing away of the bridges, of which there are several between Durkee and Huntington. The work will be done about a mile from the mouth of the narrow canyon through which the road winds, crossing and recrossing the river. It will be remembered that it was in this canyon that the bridges washed away last spring and caused the company so much trouble. It will probably take several months to complete the work, but, when it is finished, it will be as safe as any other part of the great road which the company is rapidly making the best road in the Northwest. Mr. Palmer of the Pacific Construction Co. has the contract for the work.
