FRAUD CASES

Portland, April 17 .- According to a conservative estimate, the land fraud cases have already cost the government \$35,000, and the end is not yet, nor does this amount include the fees of Prosecutor Heney. It has been given out that it is not his intention to touch a dollar of the salary allowed him as United States district attorney, a private arrangement concerning his compensation having been entered into with Attorney General Moody at the time Mr. Heney was engaged to prosecute the cases, and this understanding is said also to relate to his conduct of the California cases.

Fully 75 defendants are involved in the proceedings, and if the government's expectation that all will be con victed is realised, it will result in the accumulation of quite a fund, as the maximum fine in each case of conspiracy is \$10,000, besides two year's imprisonment, and the indictments, with a few exceptions, are based on con spiracy charges.
