Captain Truebridge of the Olympia says that a combination has been formed here against his cargo and he denounces it as an Americancott. It is understood that the reason that there are no bidders that it is thought the object of the Olympia's trip here is to take away a load of Japanese laborers. It is believed that the repetition of such trips might seriously affect the local labor supply. The Olympia will probably take her cargo back to Seattle at a heavy loss.

Explosion and Fire
Mr J W Cowen, a G A E veteran, who lives on third street met with an accident that came very near resulting seriously to him this morning. Mr Cowen has discovered how to manufacture a new and highly explosive powder, said to be more powerful for blasting than dynamite, and while he was making some of the explosive on the kitchen stove this forenoon, by some inexplicable accident, the powder exploded, blowing out one side of the kitchen and burning Mr Cowen slightly about the head and face. The kitchen caught fire immediately and an alarm was turned in, to which the fire company responded with their usual alacrity. However, by the time the company reached the scene, the family assisted by neighbors had succeeded in smothering the flames. Willing hands had assisted in removing the household goods from the house, but fortunately only the kitchen caught fire, and the damage there very slight.
