JOHN PAUL JONES

After many years searching the graves of John Paul Jones was found in Paris, where he died 113 years ago. And the remains will be brought to the United States for reinterment with ceremonies befitting the respect a great nation feels for him, its first naval hero.

This incident, it is hoped will cause this generation of Americans to recall the exploits of the young scotchman who left his native country at the age of 12 years as a common sailor boy, and in less than 30 years rose by a series of the most daring acts known in naval warfare to such fame that Thomas Jefferson declared him, during the Revolutionary war, "The principle hope of our future efforts on the Ocean." Congress voted him a gold medal and by resolution commending his "zeal, prudence, and intrepidity," and Washington wrote him a letter, complimenting him for his great work in the cause of America, and Louis XVI of France, presented him with a gold mounted sword bearing a flattering inscription.

He was born in Scotland July 6, 1747, and died in Paris, France July 18, 1792, and was honored with a public funeral by the national assembly of France. The condition of the world at the present time was so materially shaped by the events that transpired during the 45 years of John Paul Jones' existence and in which he bore an honorable part, that all Americans should familiarize themselves with it.

That Jefferson was a many sided man was made evident at the recent birthday dinners in his honor. His writings resemble the scriptures in one respect, a good argument can be found in them for almost any political view.—Wallowa News.
