AMONG THE PEOPLE

There are some of our public men, who are much better informed on the questions that attracted public attention a generation ago than on the sentiments that are moving the masses today, and such are prone to pronounce this an age of materialism over which the "almighty dollar" sits enthroned, surrounded by a council that acknowledges no criterion but self interest and personal aggrandizement, and in whose vocabulary the words right and wrong has no place. If men of this class would mingle more among the people and become familiar with their home talk they would find out their mistake and that, take the American people in this the year 1905 there never was a time when the fundamental, basic ideas of right was as much talked about, and as fervently believed in as now, nor was there ever a time in the history of our race when plans for the moral uplifting of the people were calling forth and receiving such a constancy of voluntary assistance as now.

We believe, it may be safely asserted, that at no time in the history of our people has all the Christian churches worked so nobly in harmony for the uplifting of humanity as within the past year, and at no time has the response of the masses been so cheerfully given to the efforts of the church workers. Were the numbers obtainable, the figures expressing the attendance at all the places of worship in the United States on last Easter Sunday would show by far the largest congregation that ever assembled on earth to sing the glad songs of man's hope of immortality.

In the next great uplifting force, education, we find that while our people in 1871 spent \$5.62 per scholar from 5 to 18 years of age, to place a common school education within the reach of every child in the nation, in 1902 they had cheerfully, and by their votes increased the per capita amount per

scholar spent for common schools to \$10.57. In 1870 the total expenditure for common schools in the U S was \$63,326, 666 and in 1902 it was \$235,203, 465.

A farmer in speaking before an institute of his profession, recently said, "As a rule the farmer knows no firmer friend than the country press. The home paper is distinctly the farmer's own paper, supported directly by the farmers, who compose the backbone of the printer's subscription list and largely for what enterprising merchant advertises. Now brother let us not forget our friends. Let us see that our subscription is paid before the first of May and a year in advance. The man or the paper that fights my battles shall have my support. Another thing; the merchants who advertise are the ones who make it possible for us to get a good local paper, and the men or firms who are too penurious to advertise and help support the local press have no right to the farmer's patronage. I propose hereafter to go to a good advertiser and a man who will do his share in supporting the local press, thus contributing to my support, rather than buy it of the man who proposes to take all and give nothing in return. If farmers as a class would support their friends, the other fellow would soon go out of business."
