Carnegie's Plans

New York April 28—The aim of Carnegie in making his gift of ten million dollars, is to insure to faithful teachers a competence after reaching the age limit, and to assist others forced to release their work on account of physical disability. It is also done for the purpose of raising the standard of teaching in institutions, where younger professors will be substituted for those who have outlived their usefulness. The fund is in the form of five percent first mortgage bonds in the United States steel corporation. The trustees named include twenty presidents of leading colleges of the country, among whom are presidents Hadley of Yale, Elliott of Harvard, Harper of Chicago, and Jordan of Lehigh and Stanford. The trustees will hold their offices for six years with full power to apply the funds.

SEATTLE MAY BE THE HEAD CAMP

Los Angeles, April 27—The Woodmen of the World are today discussing administrative matters. The installation of the head officers took place last night. The next head camp will probably be Seattle. The Women of Woodcraft are unable to decide on their headquarters. The session will close Saturday and the vote on the head camp will take place on that day.

Negotiations Ended

Washington, April 28—Negotiations between the United States and China for a treaty restricting the immigration of Chinese to this country practically have been abandoned. It has been found impossible by the representatives of the two governments to reach a common ground of agreement. The whole subject, therefore, is being held in abeyance until W. W. Rockhill, the recently appointed minister of the United States to China, shall arrive in Peking. It is expected that he will take up the matter directly with the Chinese government.

Care for Consumptives

Springfield April 28—The lower house of the Illinois legislature yesterday passed a bill establishing a state sanitarium for consumptives and appropriating \$50,000 for the purpose.

Northwest News

President Penrose, of Whitman College, will preach the baccalaureate sermon at Stanford University during the coming commencement week.

A negro who refuses to give his name, has been arrested at Miles City, Mont., charged with assault upon a young girl at Little Falls, Minn. The victim afterward died.

It was alleged that Joseph Shillings, a Seattle man, suicide in the insane asylum at Stillscoom. Now it is claimed that the carelessness of an attendant is responsible for his death.

The Capital Lumbering company, of Salem, has been sold to the Spaulding company, of Newburg, for \$200,000. The transfer includes the Salem mill and 4000 acres of timber in Polk county.

That 2,000,000 gallons of water daily have been used up by waste and leakage in Spokane is the conclusion of J. F. Hodgman, the pitometer expert who tested the water system for leakage during last fall and summer.

Edwin J. Brown, a Seattle dentist, is suing the state dental board for \$50,000 damages for refusing him a license. He has been arrested 12 times and alleges conspiracy to drive him out of business and from the state.

Forty-five men of the 14th infantry received their time discharges at Vancouver immediately upon their arrival from the Philippines. Every man expressed great satisfaction at being able to return to civil life and most of them started for the east at once.
