### BEAR FIGHTS

The admirers of President Roosevelt, which means every body, are being pleased and entertained with reading his exploits as a bear fighter in the wilds of Colorado, surrounded with a crowd of vigorous young men heavily armed and a score of dogs. But if they can strike the Rev. Abraham Eads of this city, when in a reminiscent mood, for a short time, out of his favorite riots among Greek Verbe Geological Strata, Astronomical Cycles and the Original language of the New Testament, he can tell of bear fights that occurred in Old Yamhill County, Oregon some sixty years ago that will make the boldest feats of the president look tame as the description of a sham battle compared with a real one.

The Rev. Eads and his father hunted bears, not for pastimes, but for food for the family, and the hides for clothing, and to protect their cows, colts, and pigs from bruin's voracious appetites. To save ammunition which was scarce in those days. After the dogs had brought the bear to bay the hunting knife made from an old file with a buck horn handle was used and no bear ever escaped the hand to claw fight.

### OUR SCHOOL LAND

The United States granted to the State of Oregon one eighteenth of the entire land surface of the State amounting to 3,362,133 acres, which the State was to dispose of and place the proceeds in an irreducible fund the interest to be used in support of common schools. Every citizen of the State should take a deep interest in the management of this immense aggregate of land property.

It is a melancholly fact that in the past land grabbers have taken much more interest in shaping the laws for the sale of our school lands and the practices there under than the common citizens with the result that our irreducible school fund is not more than one quarter as large as it should be.

C. M. Schwab has caused a sensation. He has promised the Russian admiralty to furnish them battleships with 20 per cent greater efficiency than any others afloat. They are to have the speed of fast cruisers, and yet larger than any other vessels of their class. New features of construction are to be introduced that will give the monster ships many advantages.

The death of General Fitzhugh Lee is a great loss to the country. He was of a noble lineage and proved himself worthy of his ancestry. In every position of life he was a model, beloved by all who knew

him. He was the idol of the people of Virginia in the days when he was a leader in the political affairs of the state, and when he entered the service of the national government he won the confidence and esteem of men of all parties. In Cuba he performed a delicate part with wisdom and effectiveness, and later on he served the country with distinction. President McKinley placed the greatest confidence in him and the entire country entertained the same sentiment with respect to him. It is a gallant and a great man who has gone to rest with forefathers who served their country well in their day.

### County Inspectors

The last legislature passed a law whereby upon the petition of 20 resident fruitgrowers of a county, the county court shall appoint a county fruit inspector, whose duty it shall be to inspect the apple and other fruit orchards of the county, and to enforce the fruit laws, provided that such inspector before appointment shall be recommended to be competent by the state district commissioner of the state board of horticulture. The inspector is to be paid by the county not exceeding \$3 a day for actual time employed. An inspector in an adjacent county can act where a county fails to appoint an inspector. Appeals may be taken from the inspector to the district commissioner. Approved February 22.
