Damage Suit

Miss Mae Wood has filed in the District Court of Omaha a damage suit against William Leeb, secretary to President Roosevelt, ex-Farmmaster General Robert J. Whyte, and J. Martin Miller, whom she charges with having destroyed a number of letters received by her from Senator Platt, of New York. Miss Wood recites at length the conditions that led to the securing of the letters by the defendants, and asks the court to award her damages.

Miss A. O. Wood, who is an attorney formerly practiced in Omaha, later was connected with the Leeb case. She returned to this city. She asks \$35,000 damages. Miss Wood charges that the defendants by force and threats secured from her love letters which, she alleges, were written to her by Senator Platt of New York. These letters she says in her charges, formed the basis for a book, the manuscript of which she had completed and for the publication of which she had contracted with a publisher.

Attention Campers

Section 5. The period from June 1 to October 1 in each year shall be known as the close season, during which time it shall be unlawful for any camper, farmer, logger, or other individual, firm or corporation, to set out or cause to be set out, fires in slashings, down or fallen timber, or on timber lands, or in the vicinity of said fields, without first obtaining a permit in writing or print from the county clerk of his county, as provided in section 5, and at no time shall any fire be set out when the wind is blowing to such an extent as to cause danger of same getting beyond control of the person setting same out, or without sufficient help present to control the same, and same shall be watched by the person setting the fire until the same is out, and any person violating any of the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine not less than \$100 or more than \$1000, or be imprisoned in the county jail not less than one month or more than one year. The county clerk shall keep a complete copy of all permits issued and when and to whom issued.

Plans a Secret

Last night C. I. Schmidt, superintendent of Wasco county's fruit exhibit at the fair, returned from Portland, where, with his assistants, E. H. Merrill, of this city, and Chas. Cantner, of Hood River, he has been looking over the situation in the Horticultural building. Wasco county has been assigned a space 28x33 feet near the center of the building. Sherman and Union counties being next door neighbors. While somewhat larger than those around the building, the center space does not admit of such effective display being made. We can, however, trust those who have it in charge to work to the best advantage. While down there they examined the apples which had been put in cold storage—287 boxes—and found them in splendid condition. Their plans for exhibit will not be given out, even to a reporter.—Dallies Chronicle.
