Remember the business meeting of the Commercial Club Friday evening. Friday evening of each week is a regular meeting for all the members of the club to assemble and present and discuss plans for the betterment and improvement of this city and county. The fact is the life of the Commercial Club depends to quite an extent upon the success of these meetings. The chief complaint for the past three years is that the Commercial Club has degenerated into a social club and many have expressed themselves that it should change its name. In other words was not living up the Commercial idea of its organization. During the past few weeks there have been a number of new members secured on the understanding that the Commercial Club would arouse and lead the procession toward securing additional people and payrolls.

The Club is composed of individual members and if each member shifts the burden on his neighbor the condition is just what we now have.

The Club has had three open meetings and very few of the new members attended these. At the first meeting arrangements were made to have a county exhibit at the Lewis and Clark fair. As a result of that first meeting the committee found out that the railroads would not permit literature to be scattered on the trains. This was a matter that had been in doubt for some months. At this first meeting steps were taken to make the proper application for a free city mail delivery which is being done.

The Observer mentions the benefits that these few meetings are accomplishing and what can be accomplished along this line.

At the second meeting there were committees appointed to look into the cannery proposition and promises were held out that a possibility was in sight that a hospital could be secured, but when the president called the meeting to order on last Friday evening there were hardly enough present to officially carry the motion to adjourn.

For the good of the Commercial Club and the good of the town let there be a good attendance next Friday night, and each following Friday evening.

If prunes do not sell well this year it will not be on account of a large supply in the United States. The supply now on hand is much smaller than usual.

The Oregon creameries appear to be all making much more butter this spring than ever before. It is probable that the amount of creamery butter made in Oregon has doubled in the past five years.

A plant which grows wild in Colorado and is called the "rabbit weed" has become valuable. India rubber can be obtained from its roots by a simple process, and two factories are now engaged in the manufacture. Enthusiastic citizens of Colorado now see millions in what was a few years ago a worthless weed of the plains.

There is a good deal of talk of starting fruit canneries in Oregon at the present time. In order that a cannery may be successful it is essential first that there be an abundant supply of good fruit at low prices and in considerable variety, including in Oregon Bartlett pears, Royal Ann cherries and small fruits. It is equally essential that there be plenty of cheap help. Without these essentials the best management will not make a success of the cannery business.—Oregon Agriculturist
