First Strawberries

The first Oregon strawberries on the Portland market this year reached this city April 24. The shipment consisted of two 24-pound crates, grown by J. A. Willis of Myrtle creek. Mr. L. S. Coon of Dillard, who is usually the first man to get Oregon strawberries on the market was only one day behind Mr. Willis, and his first shipment this season arrived April 25.

Last year the first Oregon berries on the Portland market reached the city on May 14, in 1902, on May 13, and in 1901, on May 7. If we are not mistaken these first shipments for the three years mentioned were all from Mr. Coon—Oregon Agriculture.

Cold In Umatilla County

One of the coldest nights experienced in Umatilla county in many seasons for this time of the year was Sunday night, the minimum temperature being 24 degrees above zero. The cold wave was quite general throughout the country and at Milton the thermometer registered 30 degrees or two degrees below freezing.

In Pendleton green cherries on many trees were badly damaged, while plum and prune trees suffered to a like extent. Whole clusters of cherries on some trees turned black, showing that the damage is extensive. Early vegetables and tomatoes and potatoes, especially, were more or less injured.

The Tribune yesterday received reports from different parts of the county, all showing that vegetation received a bad set-back from the heavy frost. Growing wheat in some of the lowlands was nipped, but to what extent the damage will be, cannot be determined for a few days.

The fruit trees on Charles Dutton's property in this city were injured to a great extent. Mr. Dutton believes that all of his cherries, plums and prunes have been completely ruined. Cass Matlock sent a twig from a cherry tree to the Tribune office which showed that nine out of ten cherries withered and turned black.

DAMAGE AT MILTON

Milton May 1—(By telephone to the Tribune)—The cold wave which visited this place last night is believed to have done considerable damage especially to early vegetables. Tomato and potato plants on many farms were frozen to the ground and other vegetables suffered to some extent. Fruit trees did not escape, but it is not believed that many of the fruits were badly injured. Strawberries were however ruined on a number of farms. The thermometer here registered 39 degrees above zero early this morning.

FREEWATER SUFFERED

Freewater May 1 (By Telephone to The Tribune)—Early vegetation in this vicinity received a hard blow last night. A heavy frost covered the ground and is believed to have done irreparable damage. Charles Sanders the merchant, reports that strawberries suffered greatly while early plants and vegetables, in many gardens, were almost totally destroyed. Fruitmen here believe that the frost injured the trees, but to what extent they are unable to determine—Pendleton Tribune.
