J. P. Morgan is 11th in the list, although he has increased his number by eight in the last 12 months. W. H. Newman stands second to Senator Depew and William K. Vanderbilt comes third.

Lumber Men Organize

Portland May 8—The Oregon Lumber Manufacturers' association was organized Saturday in this city by the lumbermen representing a daily output of fully 1,500,000 feet of lumber. The organization includes mills of the states of Oregon and Washington bordering on the Columbia river and its tributaries. It was agreed by those present to ask for better prices, as they believe the demand warrants an advance. No stipulated prices were agreed upon, as the conditions are not the same in all parts of the state.

Separate Schools

San Francisco May 8—The board of education has taken a determined stand against the admission of Chinese and Japanese pupils to schools where white children are being educated. The board unanimously adopted resolutions declaring itself opposed to the promiscuous association of white and Mongolian pupils, and declaring its policy to favor in future the establishment of separate schools for Chinese and Japanese pupils.

Rudolph and George Collins robbed the bank at Union of fourteen thousand dollars in money, and a hundred thousand dollars worth of negotiable paper on Christmas evening, 1902. Schumacher was killed while heading a posse near Collins home, at Stanpton Mo. Collins was hanged March 2 1904.
