Morris for a rebate upon a license to sell liquor within the city, had been presented to me for signature and that I had refused to sign the same upon the ground that the Council had no authority to order the warrant. I wish to say that your informant is in error in stating that the warrant had been presented to me for my signature. It was not with the other warrants when presented by the Recorder for my signature, and I have therefore as yet had no opportunity to refuse to sign the same. Whatever may be my action in the matter when the warrant is presented, I have as yet taken no action in the matter one way or the other.

When we received the above information we were very much surprised, for we had been informed by the Recorder that the mayor had refused to sign the above warrant. Upon showing the Recorder the Mayor's letter he stated that the reason this warrant had not been presented with the other warrants to the Mayor was that this account had been assigned to Messrs. Fowler and Bohnenkamp by Mr. Morris and the warrant had been delivered to Mr. Fowler.

In a conversation which occurred between the Mayor and Recorder regarding this warrant, the latter understood the Mayor to say he would not sign this warrant. Owing to the fact that several of Mr. Morris' creditors were trying to secure their debt through the payment of this rebate, the Mayor's final decision will be watched with interest.
