In the matter of the settlement with E. C. Brainard ex-county treasurer, was submitted to the County Treasurer for his report.

A prominent farmer who reside near this city has a just complaint against the policy used by this city in impounding stock and that is when such stock is taken, it should be advertised in the papers. Under present conditions if a farmers animal happens to get in the city limits, which is often the case, the owner may not know anything about it. He possibly may know his animal is missing, not always and the animal may be sold. If this notice of such was advertised in the paper, if he did not see the advertisement, in all probability his neighbor would, and under the present system of farmers phones, now so common it would seldom occur that any of the farmers stock would be sold. This would result in better feeling between the farmer and city. Under present conditions he hardly feels that he has been given a fair chance, when all the public notice, that is given, is by posting on, one or two posts about the city and often the first rains make them barely readable. The farmer certainly has a just kick in this instance.
