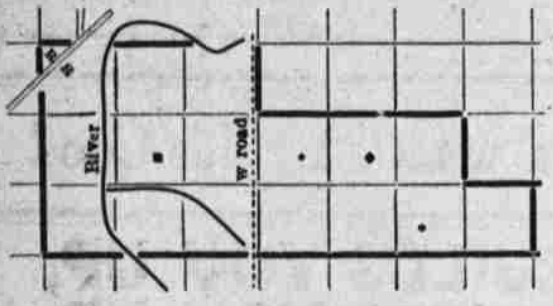

Their social life and household duties make for many a thoroughly strenuous life which, if hampered with deficient strength or disease, finally exhausts vitality. Hence those who are short of the necessary quota of strength surely break down.
If muscles remain too long contracted, they become wearied and are unable to relax. At first a night of sleep will rest them. But a continuation of such over-contraction will at length render them unable to relax during sleep.
The spinal cord is supplied by arteries and veins which pass between the vertebrae and into the spinal canal. When the muscles contract they obstruct circulation causing congestion of the spine and deficiency of nutrition. The congestion causes increased irritation to the nerves and more loss of nerve force.
