On his return from his hunting bear in the wilds of Colorado, Roosevelt tarried in Chicago on May 10th during which he made a speech at a banquet given him by the Iroquois Club, the leading Democratic Club Illinois from which the following terse but expressive sentences are taken.

The Panama Canal is going to be dug honestly and as cheaply as is compatible with efficiency first.

I shall strive to appoint and retain men (to regulate rates) who will do exactly the same justice to the railroads as they would exact from the railroads.

The most dangerous rock in the course of any republic, is the rock of class hatred. This Government is not and never shall be the government of a plutocracy. This Government is not and never shall be the government of a mob. I believe in corporations. They are indispensable instruments of our modern industrialism, but I believe that they should be so supervised and regulated that they should act for the interest of the community as a whole. So I believe in unions. I am proud of the fact that I am an honorary member of one union, but I believe that the union, like the individual, must be kept to a strict accountability to the power of the law.

I believe in unions, but the union must be kept to a strict accountability to the power of the law. If ever the need arises, back of the city stands, the state and back of the state stands the Nation.

I believe that the Federal Government must take an increasing control over corporations. I believe that representatives of the Nation should lodge in some executive body the power to establish a maximum rate; the power to see that the provisions of the law apply in full to the corporations owning private cars just as much as to the railroads themselves.

These sayings deserve a place in every one's scrap book.

Now that President Roosevelt is back in Washington with the vivifying influence of Colorado mountain zone stirring his already active circulation, we may look for things to happen with some measure of rapidity.
