**MONSTER ENGINES
READY FOR USE**

The six new freight engines which arrived in this city for use on the O. R. & N., a few days ago, have been given the finishing touches in the shops. The engines and tanks have been weighed, light and equipped, and all of them have been broken in. Master Mechanic Matheson states that the weights of the engines are as follows: The engine light, without the tender, 182,200 pounds; weight on the drivers, 162,700; weight of tender, light 49,200; engine alone equipped and ready for service, 208,400 pounds; weight of equipped engine on drivers, 187,000 pounds; tender equipped and ready for service, 133,350 pounds; total weight of engine and tender, both equipped and ready for service, 341,750 pounds. These engines are furnished with the latest improved New York air equipment, and carry two hundred pounds of steam. The air reservoir capacity is seventy five thousand cubic inches. The engines are also equipped with the Vanderbilt tanks which hold seven thousand gallons of water, and the tender has a capacity of thirteen tons of coal. No. 355, one of these engines will be sent to Kamela today for a tonnage test. The officials seem greatly pleased with and proud of the new beauties and, unless the eyes deceive, they are justly so.
