GRAVE PROBLEMS AT THE ISTHMUS

(Scripps News Association)

New York, May 20—John Barrett, United States minister to Panama, arrived here this morning on his way to his post at Bagota. He said: "The conditions at the isthmus present many difficulties engendering administrative problems of secondary consideration to the problem of health and sanitation. The climate is against us and the condition is alarming. There is a report that there are five cases of yellow fever in the colony. I do not believe in deceiving the public about these matters, for it is better that the truth be known. I believe that the sanitation and health problems will be successfully solved, but they overshadow all others."

Vetoed by Deneen

Springfield, Ill. May 20—Governor Deneen has vetoed the bill appropriating \$25,000 for a state sanitarium for treatment of tuberculosis patients. Economy was the ground on which the bill was vetoed.
