Mr King says that he intends to start the agitation in every state in the Union with the object of bringing about Government control of insurance companies.

Religious Freedom

St Petersburg May 22—Under the grant of religious freedom, heads of non-orthodox religions are making preparations for evangelical work. Sunday an orthodox Russian took communion in an Anglo-American church, an act which hitherto would have subjected both the communicant and the pastor to severe penalties. Thirty Hebrews here who had become orthodox have formally applied for permission to return to their ancient faith.
