JUDSON TAKES CHARGE

New York, May 23—State bank examiner Judson took charge of the Merchants Trust Company bank at ten o'clock this morning. The conditions of the assets and liabilities are not known at the present time.

ASSETS AND LIABILITIES

The main office of the trust company is at 346 Broadway and, according to the last statement, the assets were \$4,034,437, and the liabilities \$2,959,888. The concern has been subject to rumors in Wall Street for some time.

MADE BAD INVESTMENTS

It is reported that the bank made bad investments and that this was the cause of the failure. This morning a statement was published to the effect that a special meeting of the stockholders would be called for June 1st to vote upon a proposed increase of capital from a half a million to a million dollars. It is said that this announcement caused the closing of the doors today.

FRUIT ALONG SNAKE RIVER

Taking the Snake river valley as a whole, fruit men look for a good average yield of fruit. Certain varieties in some parts of the valley are damaged as a result of the cold weather last winter, but this damage does not extend over a very large area.

At Clarkston, where the greatest damage was suffered, there will be no peaches and only small crops of cherries and strawberries. Below Alipowa there will be a full crop of everything. Cherries of the purple Gulating variety are now ripe and are being shipped to Spokane and Lewiston. This variety will be followed by the black Tartarians in a short time, and then the Royal Anne and other sweet cherries will come.

Along the lower river the crops of peaches and pears will be large, about the same as last year, with the exception of apricots, the crop of which is small. The fruit is maturing a little earlier this year than last and may consequently bring a little better price. Montana, the Dakotas and other eastern states furnish the chief market for Snake river fruit.

Toronto, Canada, May 23.—Josephine Carr, a 13 year old girl, has confessed to the murder of William Murray, a nine months old infant. It is alleged that the girl has been in the habit of stealing baby carriages from the front of a department store while the parents were inside shopping. The police have recovered several of these carriages, which had been sold. Last Friday, the girl went to a department store and found a baby in each carriage in front of the store. She picked up the best looking baby carriage, which contained the Murray child, and made off with it. She took the child to the woods near the city and stripping it of its clothing, threw it over the embankment, causing its death. Later she placed the body in a culvert, and buried the clothing. On Saturday she made the announcement that she had discovered the child's body in the culvert. When accused of the crime she made a confession. The girl says the plan of killing the child was suggested to her by a play she had seen at the theatre.

MANY MULES BURNED
