### New Strike

Springdale Wash., May 25.—The new find of wolframite in the Cedar Canyon district, 25 miles west of Springdale, is attracting many prospectors. Over 150 seekers are now on the ground and nearly every foot of the country supposed to contain the precious metal is already staked. The first find was made some time ago and a sample sent to Germany. The assay showed a value of \$3 a pound in tungsten. This is a rare metal, used principally in the manufacture of the highest grade of steel.

Chicago, May 25.—F. A. Miller, general passenger agent of the St. Paul road has issued a circular addressed to all agents in which he requests them to strive to give all news possible to news papers. Miller takes a practical view of the subject, for he states it is good advertising.

"Newspapers want news" declares the circular. "There are many items of news that can consistently be given them. The practice of giving such items will result in calls upon you for them. We wish to do all we can for the newspapers, and in return we believe they will be friendly and fair to us. Will you bear this in mind when you come in contact with newspapermen?"

In contrast to this liberal policy, a large number of railroads issue orders prohibiting agents from doing what Miller urges agents to do.
