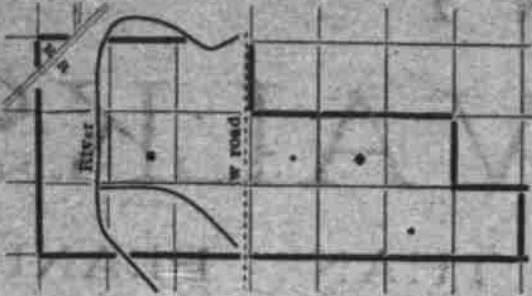

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Snake River Canal

Washington D. C. May 20—Acting Secretary of War Oliver yesterday informed Congressman Jones of Washington that he has granted a permit to the Continental Construction company to build an irrigation canal along the left bank of the Snake river near Fire Rapids, in Washington. The canal will be fifty feet wide, about five feet deep at low water and it is estimated will water about 7000 acres of land in southeastern Washington. The company proposes to install two turbines of 300 horse power each with which to supply the necessary motive power. The construction of the canal, according to the war department, will not interfere with navigation of the Snake river.

To Buy Russian Island

St. Petersburg May 20—Persistent rumors are in circulation that the American Government has proposed to purchase from Russia the Island of Saghalien, Russia, it is reported, is willing to sell. The Island of Saghalien is a long and narrow island off the East coast of Asia, separated from the mainland by the Gulf of Tartary. It is five hundred and fifteen miles long and from seventeen to twenty eight miles across. This island is very rich in lignitic coal, and the population is about twenty thousand.
