W. C. T. U. DISTRICT CONVENTION NO GUESSING BY OSTEOPATHS

La Grande is honored today by a meeting of the district convention of the Woman's Christian Temperance Union, an organization of world wide influence, represented in fifty countries.

The membership in the United States is 500,000 strong with 10,000 local unions.

In Oregon there are 100 Unions whose membership is 2000, nearly every county in the state being represented.

Attending this meeting are the national president, Mrs. M. N. Stevens and vice president Mrs. Anna A. Gordon; Mrs. Addison, state president; Mrs. Garlock, president of Idaho; Mrs. Mattie Graves, national lecturer of Centralia, Washington; Mrs. Jean Morrow of Malheur county; Mrs. Prescott of Nampa Idaho; Miss Estelle Rhine of Haines; Mrs. Thomas, Mrs. McGee and Mr. and Mrs. Parker of Elgin; Mrs. O. E. Brainard of Payette Idaho; Mrs. Fowler of Middleton Idaho and Mesdames Clark, Purcell, Wolf and Miss Wolf of Union and Mrs. Merritt formerly state organizer for Ohio.

The conference was called to order by the state president Mrs. Addison. On behalf of the local union Mrs. Rachel Worstell delivered the address of welcome. Mrs. Stevens and Miss Gordon touchingly referred to the sad affliction of the president of the local union, Mrs. Thomas Stephenson, by the death of her daughter Mrs. J. F. Baker.

Mrs. Merritt read a paper on Today's responsibility, which closed with the audience singing "The Knot of White Ribbon" composed by Mrs. Merritt.

"Our weapons and how to use them" was the subject of Mrs. Mattie Graves the national lecturer. She commenced with the Bible and followed with the advantage of the literature provided by state and national departments.

The hour devoted to the question box which was presided over by the National president, Mrs. Stevens, who imparted a great deal of information covering the various phases of the phases of the work.

At 2 o'clock the conference assembled after luncheon and "Pure food legislation as a temperance measure" was ably presented by Mrs. A. Garlock, president of the Idaho W. C. T. U.

At 2:30 "Our Day of rest, its full significance" was the topic assigned to Mrs. Jean Morrow of Malheur county. As we go to press Mrs. Addison is speaking to a parents meeting.

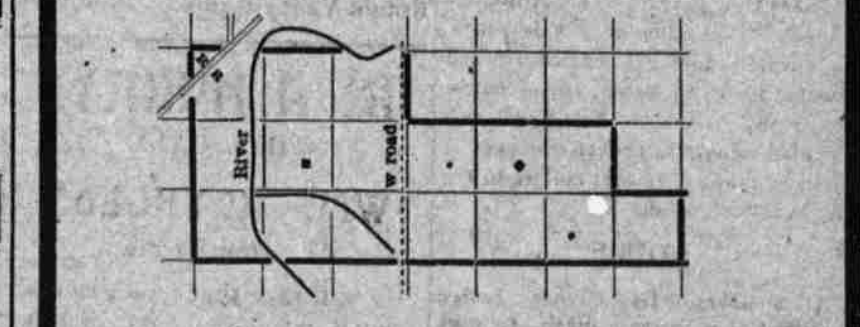
