Cove Fruit

O B Shappert, one of Cove's leading fruit growers, was in the city Saturday and in conversation with an Observer reporter stated that while the recent frosts have done considerable damage to the prune and cherry crop, there will still be a great fruit crop in Cove. Mr. Shappert is one of the directors of the Home Fruit Company, which is an association of cove fruit growers, and represents a majority of the orchards in that district. The members of the Home Fruit Company have taken for their motto "Honest pack, true grades, and right prices," and will endeavor to conform to this motto regardless of all opposition. The Home Fruit Company has a responsibility of nearly \$200,000, which makes it one of the strongest companies of its kind in the state. The managers of the company are making a strong effort to so handle the Cove fruit business as to do entirely away with the peddlers, and sell the crop through dealers only. They are now arranging with La Grande and Baker City merchants to handle the berry crop and are meeting with good success. The Home Fruit Company certainly should succeed as it is composed of many of the best men in Cove.

What Dewey Says

Washington, May 29—"It is the beginning of the end. I can see no other outcome except that Russia must sue for peace." This was Admiral Dewey's comment today when shown a report of the losses sustained by the Russian fleet. "In my opinion, the victory of the Japanese may be attributed to their training and their preparedness. Doubtless the same spirit shown in the assault on Port Arthur was exhibited in this naval battle. Such victories as we have indicate that the Japanese achieved the victory by hurling torpedo boats against the enemy."

St Petersburg May 29—It is reported that Father Gopon has returned to this city, anxious to again take part in the proceedings of the workmen, who, however, are disinclined to accept him as a leader. They affect to disbelieve the story that he has been visiting the revolutionary centers in Switzerland and also London and Paris with a view to making the general organization easier.

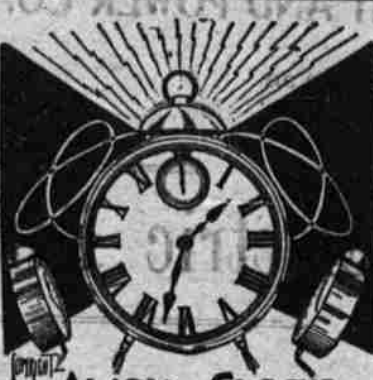
