PUT AN END TO LAND GRABBING

Washington June 3.—The commissioner of the general land office has issued instructions to registers and receivers of land offices throughout the country directing that in the future no one person shall be permitted to acquire more than 320 acres of non mineral public land under existing laws. Heretofore applicants have been permitted to increase that quantity under the timber and stone and soldier additional homestead laws. This decision does not affect mineral entries. It is believed that the new regulation will prevent persons from acquiring title to large tracts of lands through locations of scrip and warrants.

TWO MILE LAW CONSTITUTIONAL

The supreme court has passed on another two-mile limit case in another divided opinion. The majority of the court, Justice Sullivan and Ailshie, uphold the law in harmony with their previous utterances and Chief Justice Stockelager again dissents. The case came from Elmore county and is entitled Paul H. Walker and others, respondents, vs. O. F. Bacon, a sheep owner, appellant. The appeal was taken in order that the case might be carried to the supreme court of the United States.
