Circuit Court

Judge Robert Eakin opened the June term of the circuit this morning. The forenoon was occupied in going over the docket and those cases ready for trial were set.

There will be no grand jury this term. All indictments will be filed by the district attorney.

The following jurymen responded to their names and were accepted: J W Cummins, L L McKennon, Wm Ryneason, J J Carr, N F Ficklin, John Bruger, John Young, S O Gates, Oliver Ferrin, J C Miller, S Vandear, J A Gashill, Geo Corpe, John Garrett, Cecil Galloway, E E Hughes, J O Pilcher, Frank Daugherty, B F Burnett and W H Gleason.

An indictment was brought in against J O Christain for selling liquor to a minor. He pleaded guilty. The district attorney stated that there were some extenuating circumstances, in as much as the liquor was not sold and that the defendant was a close personal friend of the family, and did the act with no intention of committing a crime.

The judge stated that while he would consider the remarks of the district attorney, he would have to take cognizance of the fact that the minor in this case was a girl, which if possible was worse than if it had been a boy, and fined the defendant \$100 and revoked his license.

The case of S W Miles vs Ira Reiland was settled and dismissed.

ON TRIAL

The case on trial is O A Staples trustee of the James E Rita; bankrupt vs W G Hunter. The jury was selected at 3 o'clock. The case involves about \$2,500.
